


Leicestershire Adult Eating Disorders Service

This leaflet is designed to provide you with some information about medication and mental health conditions.

We encourage people to take an active part in understanding the reasons why they have had medication prescribed and also to give them information about any possible side effects associated with their medication. Your doctor will endeavour to explain these issues as thoroughly as possible.

However, there is also a website supported by the Leicestershire Partnership NHS Trust which is a useful and reliable source of information about psychiatric medication and several mental health conditions e.g. depression, anxiety, obsessive compulsive disorder. The information is on this website is not meant to replace medical advice but is a useful aid which can help people who, because of their mental health problems, may struggle with concentration and memory.
